<p>2      <i>Students demonstrate the ability to plan and implement research-based instruction for students with disabilities. They increase their ability to provide effective instruction as they progress through their programs of study. They learn about the essential elements of effective instruction in "knowledge" oriented courses such as EDFS 710 - Introduction to Exceptional Children and Youth. <p>3      <i>Students in the Special Education Certificate Program will demonstrate competence in managing behavior in classrooms designed for students with disabilities.
