

Respondents Results: Three-Years Post Graduation Class of 2008-2009 Executive Summary

Background Information

- ✤ 1,580 alumni invited to participate
- ✤ 303 responses; response rate of 19.18%
- Survey emailed to graduates from August 2008, December 2008, and May 2009
- Survey administered June 18th, 2012 July 3, 2012 using Qualtrics online survey tool

Employment

- ♦ 90% of respondents are currently employed or continuing their education.
- ♦ The majority of respondents (35%) are employed in the field of business and industry.
- ◆ 77% of respondents have a job that requires at least a Bachelor's Degree.
- ♦ 61% of respondents work in jobs that are moderately or highly related to their undergraduate major.
- ✤ The estimated mean annual income of respondents is \$36,500.
- ◆ The majority of respondents (46%) did not owe anything in student loans at the time of their graduation.

First Full Time Job

- ✤ 72% of respondents have found a full time job since graduating.
- ♦ 61% of respondents were able to find their first full time job before or within the first three months of graduation.
- ♦ 45% of respondents' first full time job was moderately or highly related to their major.
- ✤ 50% of respondents' first full time job was in South Carolina.

Graduate/Professional School

- ♦ 39% of respondents are attending, have completed, or have been accepted to graduate school.
- ♦ 63% of respondents enrolled in graduate school are seeking or have earned Master's Degrees.
- ♦ 30% of respondents who continue their education receive an assistantship or fellowship.
- The graduate institutions most frequently attended by respondents are: The Citadel, University of South Carolina, College of Charleston, MUSC, and University of Georgia.
- The academic disciplines most frequently mentioned by respondents are: Business Administration, Law, Education, Accounting, and Medicine.





Category of Current Employment










Reported Annual Income


- ♦ The majority (36%) of respondents make between \$30,000 and \$39,999 a year.
- ♦ The estimated mean income for all respondents is \$36,500.




Total Amount of Student Loans Owed at the Time of Graduation

 \bigstar 72% of respondents have found a full time job since graduating.






Time Taken to Find First Full Time Job









CofC's Influence on the Participation of Activities



Number of Elections You've Voted in Since Graduating




♦ The majority of respondents (34%) have voted in only one election since graduating.
