

- were more likely to be working full time than respondents from either comparison group
- were much more likely to do volunteer work than senior respondents from All 4yr Colleges and Universities, and slightly more likely than those from other 4yr Public Colleges
- were more likely to spend time traveling than senior respondents from All 4yr Colleges and Universities
- were less likely to work part-time than senior respondents from other 4yr Public Colleges



CofC senior respondents...

- were looking for employment but had not yet received an offer more often than senior respondents from All 4yr Colleges and Universities
- had offers of employment at lower rates than senior respondents from All 4yr Colleges and Universities

- transferred from a 4yr college more often than respondents from either comparison group
- transferred from a 2yr college more often than senior respondents from All 4yr Colleges and Universities
