### **Interpreting Your Report**

The BCSSE 2012-NSSE 2013 Combined Report contains item frequencies from all your BCSSE and NSSE respondents. For comparison purposes, only similar items on both instruments are included in this section (there were 18 items in the BCSSE survey identical or similar to items in the NSSE survey). These data provide the best estimates of your first-year students' pre-college characteristics and their engagement during the first year. By presenting your BCSSE-NSSE cross-sectional results side-by-side, you can identify areas of correspondence as well as gaps in engagement to develop a better understanding of the first-year student experience.

### **Longitudinal Report**

Many important changes will occur with the launch of the updated BCSSE in 2013. Many have already occurred, such as much quicker turnaround time for delivery of advising data. One important change that will occur next year is an update to the BCSSE-NSSE Combined Report, including the longitudinal section. This year, however, is a transitional year. Given that this report includes data from BCSSE 2012 with NSSE 2013 and that BCSSE 2012 content is not optimally aligned with the updates to NSSE 2013, the longitudinal section of this report is suspended for one year. Next year with the combined BCSSE 2013 and NSSE 2014 administration, we will provide the first opportunity to revamp the combined report that maximizes on content alignment between the two newly updated surveys.
